Mindfulness

At the start of this term, Joanna Coecup, a Mindfulness Teacher for Children and Adolescents, started working with our older classes. The course explores how

exercises. The children are really enjoying the sessions so far and are beginning to notice the impact of using some of the strategies on their own.

Road Safety

A member of the parish council came into school and joined a Road Safety Assembly. After the assembly the children were asked to write about ways in which we can all keep safe.

This is from **Alex in Year 5**:

We are worried that coming in for school and going out is going to cause an accident, here are some things you can do to help:

1. When dropping off your children, please do not drop and go. Drop and go is when you stop the car but the engine is still on then you let your child open the door and run off to school. Instead, you should stop the car, park and drop your children off.

2. When you are dropping your child off at school, please make sure that when your child opens the door of the car there are no vehicles coming past.

3. When driving make sure you don't go over the speed limit (30mph). This can be really dangerous if there are other cars passing by or children crossing the road.
